Where to Go for Help

1. OICE

The Office for International Cooperation & Exchange (OICE) is located on the first floor of Bldg. No. 3, next to the Student Service Center. General office hours are 10:00 a.m. - noon, 1 p.m. – 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. We welcome walk-ins during business hours for daily life questions, lab-related problems, and other concerns. If you would like to make an appointment for a private consultation, please call or email us. Your well-being is our utmost concern, and we will protect your privacy.

2. Student Service Center

Student Service Center is where official business is conducted. Sections in the Student Service Center and their services that are of particular importance to international students are listed below.

- International Student Section: housing, scholarships, an extension of the period of stay, etc.
- Student Support Team:
 - ★ Graduate Student Section, Undergraduate Student Section: course registration, credit confirmation, certificates, entrance exams, and other official matters.
 - ★ Student Life Support Section: tuition exemption, career-related information, campus life, study abroad, etc.
- Department Support Team: department-related matters, classroom reservation, submission of department-related documents, etc.

There is also a copying machine and a certificate issuing machine (certificate of enrollment, transcript, a certificate for coursework completion/expected graduation, etc.) at the Student Service Center.

What to Do on Arrival

Details on arrival procedures are on our website.

- Resident Registration (municipal office): Register your address within 14 days of choosing your accommodation. A residence card and a document showing your address are required to complete the transaction. The same applies when you move inside Japan.
- 2. National Health Insurance (municipal office): You are required to subscribe to the <u>National Health Insurance Plan</u>. It will cover 70% of the medical cost. Premiums vary depending on the place of residence and income.
- 3. National Pension System (municipal office): All residents are required to enter the

<u>National Pension</u> System. Students with limited income may apply for exemption or postponement of payments.

- 4. Enrollment Registration (Graduate Student Section, Undergraduate Student Section): Submit the necessary documents within the designated period. A Student ID Card will be issued during the enrollment period. Register the ID card at the <u>library</u> to use it as a library card.
- 5. SECOM card (Graduate School Section): SECOM card is the IC card required to enter the building at night and on weekends, holidays. Apply at the Student Section for a SECOM card.
- 6. Bank Account: Japanese Government (MEXT) scholarship recipients must open an account at the Japan Post Bank.
- 7. Medical Check-up: Reserve <u>online</u> for a check-up for newly admitted. Yearly check-ups are necessary while you are enrolled at UTokyo.

Programs and Services

1. Tutor Support

Graduate students (including research students) who have been in Japan less than one year can receive <u>tutor support</u>. If you think you are not receiving proper tutor support for any reason, <u>contact us</u>.

2. Language Support

The <u>Center for Japanese Language Education</u> offers various Japanese language <u>courses</u>. Our <u>website</u> includes information on some of the other free online Japanese courses.

3. <u>University Guarantor System</u>

The University will act as a guarantor for international students renting <u>private</u> <u>accommodations</u> if eligibility conditions are met.

4. <u>Visa Consulting Service</u>

Free consultation services regarding visa status are available at Hongo, Komaba, and Kashiwa campuses. Check the website for details.

5. <u>International Student Support Room</u>

Individual counseling, advising sessions, one-stop drop-in support services are available at the Hongo Campus.

6. Housing Office

The housing office provides information about accommodations. Information is

also available on our website.

7. UTokyo WiFi

A WiFi network service is available for university members.

8. Gotenshita Memorial Arena

Gotenshita Memorial Arena is a sports complex featuring a training room, swimming pool, exercise studio, gymnasium, climbing wall, bouldering wall, and Gotenshita ground. Students can use the arena for 400 yen/day or purchase a pass card. Various exercise programs such as yoga, pilates, dance, and tai-chi are offered free of additional charge.

- IMAS: Inbound Medical Assistance Service for International Students at UTokyo A
 24/7 365 days-a-year Medical Assistance (Japanese/English/Chinese) for international students. You need to apply online to use the service.
- 11. The Graduate School of Agricultural and Life Sciences (GSALS) is a member of the <u>Career Support Network for International Students in Japan</u>. Check our <u>website</u> for details and on how to use Career Support Network.

Financial Matters

- 1. <u>Tuition and Admission Fees Exemption</u>: Check the website for eligibility and application forms.
- 2. <u>Part-Time Job</u>: A special permission from the immigration bureau is necessary to work part-time. Check the website for details.
- 3. Insurance: Students are automatically covered for injuries while engaging in educational/research activities under "Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research."
- 4. <u>Student Discounts</u>: Students can receive discounts for travel, commuting trains and some museums. Student Travel Discount Certificates are available from the certificate issuing machine in the Student Service Center.

Your Responsibilities

1. Overseas Travel: You must submit a form to the International Student Section

- before and after your travel abroad for any reason, including a visit to your home country. Forms are ready for download from our <u>website</u>.
- 2. Moving within Japan: Update your address via UTAS (regular students) or at the Student Service Center (research students). Make sure to report to the municipal office as well. Details are on our <u>website</u>.
- 3. Enrollment Confirmation: Students receiving MEXT/honors/Koryu Kyokai/JICA scholarships need to confirm their enrollment every month. Check our website for the <u>schedule</u>.
- 4. Residence Card: Always carry your Residence Card with you.
- 5. Period of Stay: The period of stay is determined upon entering Japan. If you wish to continue residing in Japan beyond the designated date, you need to apply for an <u>extension</u>. You can apply for an extension of your period of stay up to 3 months before the expiration date.
- 6. Bicycles: Follow safety rules. It is advisable to obtain additional insurance. To park on campus, register <u>online</u>. The parking fee is 1000 yen per year for students. For more information on bicycles, check our <u>website</u>.

On-Campus Rules

- 1. Waste Disposal: Strict rules apply. Consult with your lab-mates for details.
- 2. Smoking: Prohibited except in designated areas.
- 3. Late Nights and Holidays: Carry your ID card with you and show it to campus patrol when asked.
- 4. University Rules: Check the website.
