(ii) Explain the significance and originality of your research.

4. Research Achievements Each item should be listed with serial numbers, categorized into the following three sections. The applicant's name must be underlined. Please **maintain the current frame size**. In case of an extensive list, prioritize essential items and denote additional items as "Other XX reports," etc., at the end of each category, excluding those not yet accepted. Author's names should be listed in the same order as they appear in the publications/presentations. If an author's name is omitted, please indicate the total number of authors and the applicant's position on the author list.

(1) Publications (inclusive of papers, bulletins, collections of papers, etc.) - Please specify if peer-reviewed. If applicable, include papers under review. Author names, paper titles, journal names, volume numbers, page numbers (start - end), and publication years should be listed in this order.

(2) Presentations at conferences, symposiums, etc. - Specify oral or poster presentations, and whether peer-reviewed. List author names, presentation titles, conference names, locations, months, and years of presentation. Place a ○ symbol preceding the presenter's name. Accepted presentation applications may also be included.

(3) Others (awards received, etc.).
