The following is a supplement to the Application Guideline for the 2025 for the Master's Course, Graduate School of Agricultural and Life Sciences, the University of Tokyo.

<Schedule A>

1. Application Period

From Wednesday, June 19, 2024 (10:00 a.m.) to Tuesday, June 25, 2024 (5:00 p.m.)
Please read the Application Guideline carefully before applying.

2. Written Examinations

(1) Foreign Language (English)

Applicants must take the TOEFL-ITP (LEVEL 1) administered by the Graduate School.

For details, please refer to "7. Written Examination (Foreign Languages)" in the Application Guideline.

(2) Specialized Subjects

At the time of application, students must select two courses from Group 1 and one course from Group 2.

(Group 1) 1) Rural Land and Environmental Engineering, 2) Water Environmental Engineering, 3) Soil Physics and Soil Hydrology, 4) Bioenvironmental Engineering, 5) Biological and Mechanical Engineering, 6) Bioprocess Engineering, 7) Biological and Environmental Information Engineering, 8) Sustainable Agro-ecosystem Engineering, 9) Ecological Safety Studies

(Group 2) Fundamental questions will be asked on your specialized subjects.

Select one subject from 1) Mathematics, 2) Physics, 3) Chemistry, or 4) Biology.

However, students selecting 8) Sustainable Agro-ecosystem Engineering or 9) Ecological Safety Studies as their field of specialization in (Group 1) may only do so as their first choice. These courses may not be selected as second choice courses.

The examination will be conducted face-to-face in a written format (questions will be given in Japanese).

3. Oral Examination

A face-to-face or online oral examination will be conducted. The date, time, and other details will be provided in the "Guidelines for Examinees".

(1) Notes on inputting information into the Web Entry S2system

- a. All designated fields must be filled in. If any field is not filled in, the application will be treated as incomplete.
- b. Enter the name of the applicant's preferred field of specialization and the name of the applicant's preferred faculty advisor(s) up to the third choice, referring to the "List of faculty members and their fields of specialization" in the Application Guideline. You may enter another faculty member in the same specialty as a second or third choice. However, you are not required to enter names if you do not have second or third choices.

- c. Be sure to enter the name of the subject you will take in the "Specialized Subject" column. If not entered, the application will be treated as incomplete.

1. Application Period

From Thursday, November 21, 2024 (10:00 a.m.) to Wednesday, November 27, 2024 (5:00 p.m.)

2. Written Examinations

(1) Foreign Language (English)

Applicants must take the TOEFL-ITP (LEVEL 1) administered by the Graduate School. For details, please refer to "7. Written Examination (Foreign Languages)" in the Application Guideline.

(2) Specialized Subjects

At the time of application, students must select two courses from Group 1 and one course from Group 2.

(Group 1) 1) Rural Land and Environmental Engineering, 2) Water Environmental Engineering, 3) Soil Physics and Soil Hydrology, 4) Bioenvironmental Engineering, 5) Biological and Mechanical Engineering, 6) Bioprocess Engineering, 7) Biological and Environmental Information Engineering, 8) Sustainable Agro-ecosystem Engineering, 9) Ecological Safety Studies

(Group 2) Fundamental questions will be asked on your specialized subjects.

Select one course from 1) Mathematics, 2) Physics, 3) Chemistry, or 4) Biology.

However, students selecting 8) Sustainable Agro-ecosystem Engineering or 9) Ecological Safety Studies as their field of specialization in (Group 1) may only do so as their first choice. These courses may not be selected as second choice courses.

The examination will be conducted face-to-face in a written format (questions will be written in both Japanese and English).

3. Oral Examination

A face-to-face or online oral examination will be conducted. The date, time, and other details will be provided in the "Guidelines for Examinees".

4. Examination Dates

The examinations will be conducted over two days from Thursday, January 30, 2025, to Friday, February 7, 2025.

The date, time, and other details of the examination will be provided in the "Guidelines for Examinees" to be sent by e-mail in early January 2025.

5. Documents to be submitted

Documents to be submitted should be (a) through (h) in accordance with "10. Application Documents" in the Application Guideline.

6. October Admission

This department does not offer October admission.

7. Other matters

- (1) Applicants for Schedule B of this major must meet items (2) and (3) of 1. Application Requirements in the Application Guideline. However, even for those who have graduated or are expected to graduate from a Japanese university, those who have graduated (or are expected to graduate) from a program of education, including elementary and secondary education, in a language other than Japanese will be screened for application eligibility. Therefore, please contact the Graduate Student Section, Academic Affairs Division, Graduate School of Agricultural and Life Sciences by Wednesday, October 9, 2024. Applications will be accepted from applicants who have been allowed to apply based on the screening results and they will be permitted to take the examination.
- (2) Notes on inputting information into the Web Entry System
