1. Application Period

From Thursday, November 21, 2024 (10:00 a.m.) to Wednesday, November 27, 2024 (5:00 p.m.)

2. Written Examinations

(1) Foreign Language (English)

Submit official TOEFL-iBT or TOEFL-iBT Home Edition scores.

For details, please refer to "7. Written Examination (Foreign Languages)" in the Application Guideline.

(2) Specialized Subjects

An essay on Aquatic Bioscience is required.

The examination will be an online written examination (questions will be given in both English and Japanese).

3. Oral Examination

The exam will be conducted online.

4. Examination Dates

The examination will be held from Thursday, January 30 to Friday, February 7, 2025. Notification on the date, time, and other details of the examination will be provided in the "Guidelines for Examinees' "to be sent to examinees by e-mail in early January 2025.

5. Documents to be submitted

Documents to be submitted should be (a) through (I) in accordance with the "10. Application Documents" in the Application Guideline.

6. October Admission

This department does not offer October admission.
